Boosting Innovation - new initiatives


The main goal of the Swiss Alliance of Data-Intensive Services is pushing forward innovation for data-based value creation in Switzerland, in particular innovation created by the members of our Alliance.

For increasing the innovation speed and creating even more innovation projects, the board has decided recently to launch three new innovation initiatives. They are shortly explained in the following. 1. Innovation Initiative "From ideas to projects"

The Innovation Initiative "From ideas to projects" is specifically shaped for Industrial members. The objective of this initiative is to support Industrial members developing vague ideas into a concrete project proposal, to define a roadmap, to set up a suitable project team by involving the different competencies within the Alliance, to go the first steps towards a solution, and to help getting funding. The initiative will support companies in the first steps of the innovation process.

The initiative is set up as a three-step process where each step may be supported by the Alliance with specific funding. Industrial members can apply for this support via the office.



A1: Explore

<u>Goal:</u> The goal of the "Explore" step is to define a validated first idea for an innovation project, and to formulate a realistic project goal. In addition, funding opportunities (e.g. Innosuisse funding, or other funding programs) will be explored.

<u>Content:</u> This step typically consists of an one day workshop with an expert from outside the company. The expert will help to validate the idea and show ways to realize it. Questions could be: What is a realistic goal? What is needed to reach the goal?

Support for Alliance Industrial members:

- The office helps identifying an appropriate expert within Data+Service.
- The Alliance will fund this expert for his work.

• In many cases, the industrial member can apply for up to 15 kCHF from Innosuisse for digging into technological issues (Innocheck program). With this funding, the "Explore" step can be largely extended. The office will support for the application process.

A2: Deep Dive

<u>Goal:</u> The goal of the "Deep Dive" step is to go a first step towards a solution and develop a first Proof-of-Concept. An additional result of this step is a preliminary project plan for a larger innovation project.

<u>Content:</u> This step consists of a one week Deep Dive with experts from outside the company (e.g. from a university institute). The main elements of the solution approach are explored and the general feasibility is checked. Furthermore, a goal of this step is to get a clear understanding which elements of the solution can be taken from the shelf, and which elements have to be newly developed - the result is a clear roadmap for reaching the final goal.

<u>Funding:</u> The Alliance will fund 5 working days of external experts. .

A3: GO

<u>Goal:</u> The goal of the "GO" step is to get funding via <u>Innosuisse</u> or <u>EUResearch</u> and start a project within the next 6 months, depending upon the application process.

<u>Support:</u> The office will support a call for participation to find appropriate project partners, which may be other Industrial members or researchers from the Academic members.

The board has defined a restricted budget for funding these steps. We encourage all of our Industrial members to profit from this offer. Please contact Gundula Heinatz Bürki (gundula.heinatz@data-service-alliance.ch) directly for the next steps.

2. Match-Making Event: Academia & Industry

The Match-Making Event is shaped for all Alliance members. The objective

is to bring together different ideas from Academic and Industrial members, sharpen them in a joint discussion, and find best fits among industrial and academic experts for pushing them forward and create tangible innovation.

The event is set up in the form of a workshop. Every participant will share innovation idea for which he searches partners within Data+Service. Academic members can present ideas based on their research results, for finding appropriate application partners for a research project, or for getting useful data from industry to support the research. For Industrial members, the event is an opportunity to discuss ideas, get feedback or inspiration for solution approaches, and of course to find appropriate project partners among the researchers or experts from other companies.

The first such event will be organized in autumn 2018. Stay tuned and don't miss the call for participation.

3. Startup Grant 2018/2019

We will launch a specific support program for startups for allowing small companies with restricted financial means to become member of Data+Service and enrich the community with their creative potential. The main idea is that startups may receive a free membership for 2 years if they engage in an innovation project with another member of the Alliance. So, if a startup is active in creating innovation within the context of the Alliance, they are doing exactly what the Alliance is made for, and they are made a member of our innovation community even if they cannot afford a regular membership.

The Startup Grant has been approved by the board of Data+Service for the next two years, and each year five startups will be supported with this grant. These startups can profit from the knowledge and expertise of the other members of the Alliance, while bringing in their own expertise at the same time.

Startups may apply via the office (info.office@data-service-alliance.ch). The office will search the appropriate project partner via call for participation within the Alliance. Additionally, the office will support in getting funded via Innosuisse or EUResearch or through direct financing. As soon as the

project is started, the startup will become Silver member, while the membership fee is covered by the Alliance for maximum 2 years.
